
The Davis Centre is a "Centre of Excellence, with a Made-for-Peel solution"

Celebrating 10 Years of Walk-In

This year, we celebrate 10 years of our Walk-in Counselling Clinic. 10 years! In that time, we have served 16,487 people. That means that over sixteen thousand people left our offices more hopeful than when they walked in. Our evaluation data tells a story of service to our community. People felt welcomed, that they received good service, they felt we were sensitive to their culture, and they got connected to other services when they needed them. People told us that they would recommend the Walk-in Counselling Clinic to a friend, and our guess is, they did.

We were the first organization among our Catholic Family Services sister agencies to launch Walk-in. Now, ten years later, all five of us provide this service within the GTA. Our innovative and earnest approach to responding to the needs of our community has caught the attention of our community as well as policy makers across a variety of provincial ministries. We have accomplished all this because of our staff. Everyone plays a role in service delivery.

Thank you to our staff for the part they play in bringing about the vision of CFSPD, for an inclusive community of healthy individuals, strong relationships and resilient families. We know there is no resilience without community. Because of our staff, thousands of people left CFSPD feeling like they mattered, like someone in this growing, sprawling community cared.

Collaborations Led by CFSPD

- The HEAL (Helping End Abuse for Life) Network is a partnership of 19 social service organizations dedicated to supporting mothers and children exposed to violence through family and group counselling. The network also engages in violence prevention through youth groups and public education workshops.
- The Safe Centre of Peel is a safe and welcoming space where many agencies work together at one location, offering support and compassionate care to adults, children and youth affected by abuse and violence in Peel. This collaboration consists of 10 onsite agencies, 9 offsite partners, and a multitude of community partners serving hundreds of individuals every year.
- The Good Food Brampton Community Kitchen grows access to food through working respectfully with our community in all its diversity to increase knowledge of food and nutrition, develop skills in food preparation and empower participation in building a sustainable food system.

Sistering and Wellness


- The Sistering Program supports women who have experienced violence, through mentorship and social events

 A project that supports local parishes to implement friendly visiting programs for vulnerable seniors






BUILDING REVENUE \$1,164,904




OPERATING EXPENSES \$4,487,934
